In 1981, the Alumnae of the Sacred Heart of Bloomfield Hills instituted the Community Service Award. This award was established to recognize Sacred Heart's strong support of the service program in the Upper School. As the Alumnae and Alumni Association believes in service to the wider community, it was decided that this award would be given annually to a graduating senior who has been exemplary in her service to others. Because they know her best, it is the faculty and senior students who participate in this selection.

The student is chosen on the basis of three criteria:

- Consistent responsibility and dedication to service,
- The development of a positive attitude and enthusiasm for service, and
- A valuable or significant contribution to the service program.

**Angela Cavanagh**<sup>'14</sup> is the recipient of the 2014 Alumnae and Alumni Community Service Award. Angela's work models Goal III – "Schools of the Sacred Heart commit themselves to a social awareness that impels to action." During Angela's four years at the Academy of the Sacred Heart Upper School, she demonstrated an undying commitment to serving others within the community. Angela's many contributions include:

- Serving at St. Elizabeth Briarbank Assisted Living Facility for Women,
